GOD'S PROMISE

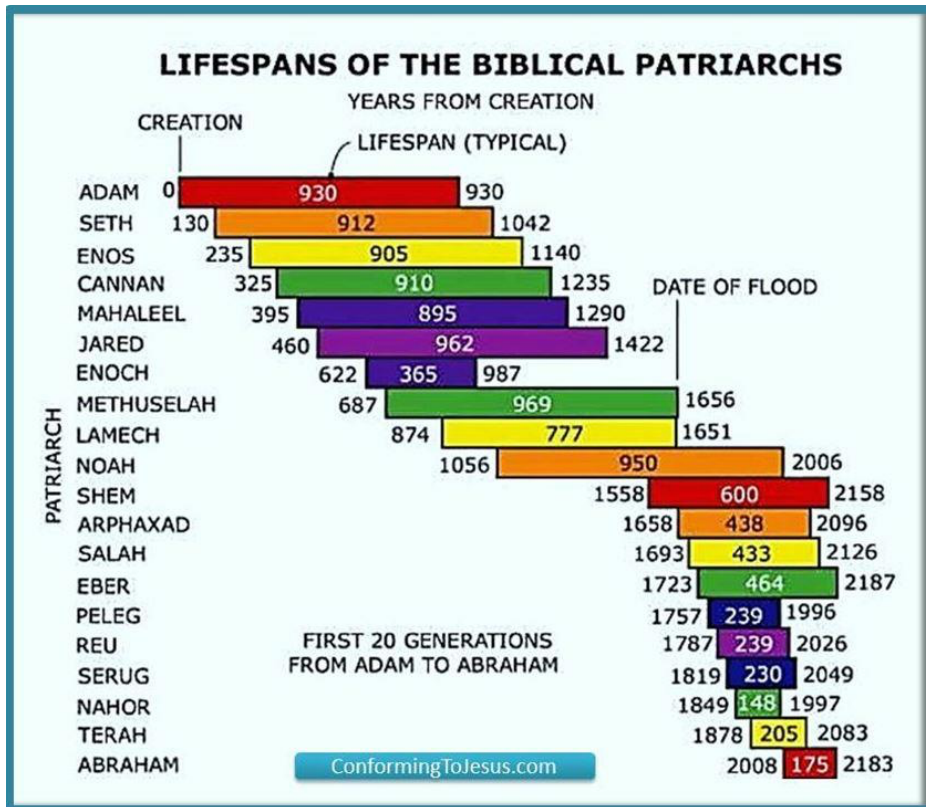
Genesis 5, 6

1. We can see God's promise in Genesis 3:15 was **secure** through the generations of Adam and Seth leading to Noah, to Abraham, to David and ultimately to the promised seed, Jesus.

Luke 3:23-38; Galatians 3:16

2. God's promise can be trusted with **confidence**.

Genesis 5; Psalm 12:6-7



This "chain of **testimony**" from Adam to Abraham establishes the historical reliability of the early Genesis accounts and preserves the promise being fulfilled.

3. God's Promise of **grace** is available to everyone who knows they are hopeless without a supernatural cleansing of their sin. Genesis 4:25-26; Ephesians 2:8-9; Romans 3:21-26

Genesis 6

5 Then the Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually.

6 And the Lord was sorry that He had made man on the earth, and He was grieved in His heart. 7 So the Lord said, "I will destroy man whom I have created from the face of the earth, both man and beast, creeping thing and birds of the air, for I am sorry that I have made them."

8 But Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord.

Romans 4

20 He did not waver at the promise of God through unbelief, but was strengthened in faith, giving glory to God, 21 and being fully convinced that what He had promised He was also able to perform. 22 And therefore "it was accounted to him for righteousness." 23 Now it was not written for his sake alone that it was imputed to him, 24 but also for us. It shall be imputed to us who believe in Him who raised up Jesus our Lord from the dead, 25 who was delivered up because of our offenses, and was raised because of our justification.

Romans 5

1 Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, 2 through whom also we have access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God.

3 And not only that, but we also glory in tribulations, knowing that tribulation produces perseverance; 4 and perseverance, character; and character, hope.

5 Now hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out in our hearts by the Holy Spirit who was given to us.
